AMERICAN/CANADIAN EXCHANGE

JRA members, who are 18 years of age and older, may apply to represent the JRA and the RAAA as junior ambassadors to the Canadian Junior Showdown held each year in July.

Two JRA members are selected for the Exchange program. Travel expenses to Canada are provided by the JRA/RAAA. Upon arrival in Canada, the Exchange representatives will be hosted by the Canadian Junior Angus Association for three days of fun, contests, cook-off and heifer show.

The 2010 Canadian Showdown will be held July 8 - 10 in Saint Hyacinthe, Quebec. JRA representataives will travel to Canada on July 7 and return to the U.S. on July 11. Passports are required!

Interested JRA members must complete an application by May 1 and:

- must be at least 18 years of age
- must hold a valid passport by date of travel
- must have attended a minimum of two JRA Round-Up events

Applications are available online. Go to the Junior Page and select American/Canadian Junior Exchange Program.

JRA OFFICER APPLICATIONS

Current, active JRA members, who are 16 years of age and older by the day of officer elections, may apply to serve on the JRA National Board of Directors.

Applicants must:

- be 16 years of age by day of election
- have attended at least one Round-Up prior to year of application
- must attend Round-Up the year of application
- must have a continuous JRA membership of a minimum two years prior to year of application

Positions open for election in 2010 are:

Region I - West: Alaska, California, Hawaii, Idaho, Nevada, Oregon, Washington

Region II - Mountains: Colorado, Montana, Utah, Wyoming

Region III - South: Alabama, Arkansas, Arizona, Florida, Georgia, Louisiana, Mississippi, New Mexico, North Carolina, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas

Applications may also be submitted for any At Large opening (if there is no candidate from a region). These applications must be submitted by May 1 and follow the same guidelines as a regional applicant.

Applications must be completed and received by May 1. Applications may be downloaded from the website or found in the March issue of the Red Generation.

The Champion Bred and Owned Bull Calf was exhibited by Celia Karweik, Hopkins, MI.

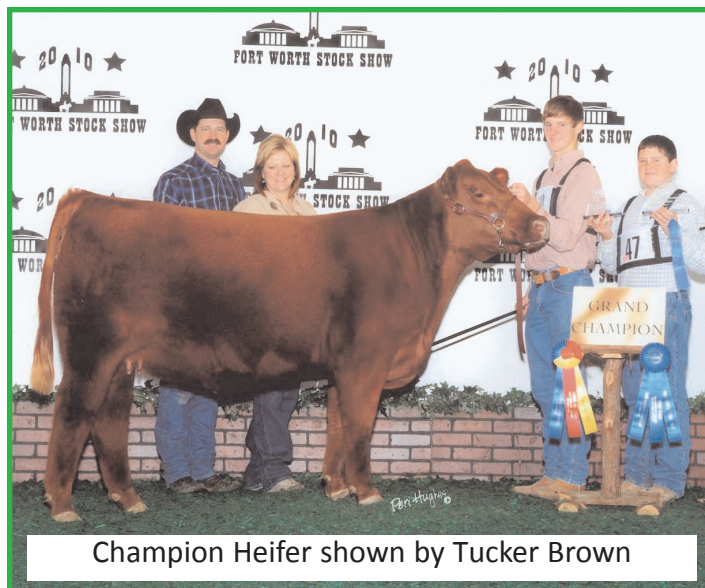
